Founded with the passion of "Devotion to the Nation" and the vision of building a "Prosperous India", HUDSA is dedicated to uplifting the underprivileged and marginalized sections of society.

The organization is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and holds certifications under Section 80G and 12A of the Income Tax Act, making it eligible to receive tax-exempt donations.

By conducting workshops and seminars, the organization continuously motivates students and youth to develop their talents and become valuable contributors to nation-building.

Special programs are organized to encourage scientific thinking among children and help them think outside the box.

HUDSA believes that today's children are the architects of tomorrow's India. Hence, special focus is given to character building and value education.

The organization strongly advocates that education is essential to fight social injustice, promote economic growth, and address environmental issues.

Yoga is being widely promoted by HUDSA in Prayagraj district to enhance the physical, mental, and spiritual well-being of youth and children, encouraging a positive mindset and healthy lifestyle.



Samdariya School of Special Education

In line with its mission, HUDSA established the Samdariya School of Special Education in 2019, located in Dandupur, just 3 km from Chaka, the block headquarters of Yamunapar, Prayagraj.

This school is recognized by the Government of Uttar Pradesh and is dedicated to the education and development of poor and differently-abled children. It focuses on nurturing hidden talents, building discipline and moral values, and connecting students with the mainstream of development.

The local office of HUDSA also operates from within the school premises. After school hours, the premises are utilized to organize various meetings and seminars on topics related to social awareness and



PROGRAMMES IMPLEMENTED

Certain Activities and Achievements

In 2022-23 HUDSA made significant strides toward improving access to quality education for underprivileged children and youth in Prayagraj, UP. Our focus remained on inclusive education, digital literacy, teacher training, organizing seminars and workshops, for social, cultural upliftment and awareness and infrastructure development. This report outlines our achievements, challenges and the impact of our work over the past year.

With its limited resources, the organization has tried to reach out to children from 1 other schools in the area in addition to the Samdariya school it has established itself. In this way, *a total number of 100 poor children have been identified so far in which there are about 60 girls and 20 private school teachers were called to the center and trained.*



The organization primarily operates in Uttar Pradesh, particularly in the Prayagraj district. It works extensively in the field of education and training. The organization runs the Samdariya School of Special Education, where underprivileged girl students receive free education. To promote awareness about education, the organization establishes *public communication in rural areas* through its volunteers and conducts rallies to encourage child education. Samdariya School also provides free computer training to poor children and makes every effort for their holistic development.

On August 13, 2022, under the *Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav* initiative, a seminar was held. Dr. Rama Singh, Principal of Arya Kanya Post Graduate College affiliated with Allahabad Central University, participated as the chief guest. Rishi Dev Tripathi, State General Secretary of Rashtriya Shaikshik Mahasangh, and a large number of scholars and teachers were also present.





The institution is constantly working toward women empowerment. It continuously counsels poor and helpless women, encourages them to learn skills based on their interests and abilities, and works towards providing them with employment opportunities. Regular workshops are organized for sewing, embroidery, knitting, printing, and beautician training to make women self-reliant.

On October 5, 2022, a seminar was organized on the theme "*Sanatan Sanskriti ke Sanvahak: Dr. Radhakrishnan*". The chief guest of the seminar was Dr. Ashutosh Tripathi, President of the R.K. Group of Institutions, and the special guest was Dr. Shiv Shankar Srivastava, Associate Professor at S.S. Khanna College affiliated with Allahabad Central University, along with many other distinguished scholars. On this occasion, several teachers were also honoured.



On October 14, 2022, the organization organized an educational tour for children. During this significant event in their lives, the children visited the Public Library at Amar Shaheed Chandrashekhar Park in Prayagraj, Victoria Tower, the Ganganath Jha Sanskrit Institute, and also observed the historical and cultural heritage preserved in the museum. Afterwards, they lit candles and paid tribute at the statue of Chandrashekhar Azad. On this occasion, the Hon'ble Member of Parliament from Allahabad, Professor Rita Bahuguna Joshi, discussed various aspects of the freedom struggle.

On November 17, 2022, while expressing his views on universalization and inclusive education, the *Speaker of the Madhya Pradesh Legislative Assembly*, Mr. Girish Gautam, praised the work of the organization.





A special lecture on the theme "*The Tradition of Knowledge in Sanatan Culture*" was organized on December 7, 2022. The keynote speaker was Professor Nilimp Tripathi from the Vedic University, Bhopal Madhya Pradesh. Attendees highly appreciated her scholarly discourse. Dr. Madhukaracharya Tripathi, Principal of Indrakali Post Graduate College, also contributed meaningful insights during the session.

On January 28, 2023, a seminar was held on the *Ramcharitmanas* scripture. The Shankaracharya of Puri, Swami Adhokshjanand Dev Teerth, was the chief guest and shared his valuable insights. He described the Ramcharitmanas as a priceless treasure of Sanatan culture. A large number of elderly villagers, women, and children were present and viewed the event as a significant step toward raising awareness of Sanatan values.



On February 4 and 5, 2023, the organization conducted a *two-day health check-up camp*. A team of doctors, including Dr. Pradeep Sharma, was present at the camp. Approximately 300 children underwent health examinations during the event. On this occasion, the doctors educated the children about the importance of a disciplined lifestyle and advised them to avoid junk food.

The organization celebrates various *National Festivals* every year, including Independence Day (15 August), Republic Day (26 January), Gandhi Jayanti (2 October), Teachers' Day (5 September), and Children's Day (14 November) by organizing various cultural and social programs. These programs are usually held on the school premises, where children participate in competitions and are awarded prizes.



Infrastructure Development

- This year, a concrete floor was built in the muddy ground of the school premises.
- Chairs, tables, other furniture, fans, and computers for the children were purchased.
- Supplies and materials were procured to support children's cultural activities and performances.

Impact Assessment

- ✓ Children actively participate in cultural events, educational tours and science exhibition.
- ✓ Regular counselling and life skill training support their mental and emotional health.
- ✓ The School has become a hub for community interaction and awareness, with parents, teachers and local volunteers actively involved.
- ✓ There was a great deal of enthusiasm observed among the underprivileged children and their parents. A special sense of hope was instilled in them.

Challenges Faced

- * Lack of adequate classrooms, furniture, sanitation, and learning aid affects the quality of education.
- * In rural and underserved areas, poor transportation and connectivity also hinder access for both students and teachers.
- * In low- income communities, parents may not prioritize education due to financial pressures or lack of awareness.
- * Access to technology is limited, which affects Digital learning and hampers student's exposure to modern tools and methods.

Partnerships & Collaborations

- ❖ At present, the organisation's work is progressing with the support of local donors, well-wishers, and distinguished social workers. The partnership has proven to be a blessing for the organisation.

- ❖ Collaboration with many local NGO, private schools, college/university provided valuable volunteer support, intellectual reflection and youth engagement for community events and awareness programs.
- ❖ Initiative to expand digital learning program at primary level.

- Conducting awareness programs for women's empowerment.
- Raising awareness among youth about the growing threat to cultural values.
- Generating excitement among children towards science and technology.
- Organising seminars and workshops for social awareness.
- Creating awareness among people about traditions and arts.

Plans for Next Year (2023-24)

- Increasing digital literacy in rural areas
- By meeting with parents and local influencer people encouraging more children to enrol in schools
